Specialty Care

TEAM-BASED APPROACH, COORDINATING YOUR SPECIALIZED CARE.

- Diagnosis and treatment of certain acute conditions, such as metabolic disorders, or cancers
- Certain procedures and surgeries, such as orthopedic surgery
- Management of some complex chronic conditions
- Consults

Some Specialties require a referral prior to being seen.

OFFERS SAME-DAY MINOR MEDICAL TREATMENT

- Minor injuries, cuts, and abrasions
- Abdominal pain
- Fractures/Sprains
- Severe colds, flu, and fevers
- Sore throats, ear aches, and other respiratory problems
- Back, joint, or muscle pain
- Allergic reactions

Emergency Department

CARE FOR SEVERE AND LIFE-THREATENING SITUATIONS THAT REQUIRE IMMEDIATE MEDICAL ATTENTION

Adult Emergencies

- Sudden numbness in face, arms or legs
- Sudden change in vision
- Serious head, neck or back injury
- Difficulty breathing
- Bleeding that won't stop
- Chest pain or pressure
- Severe burn
- Seizure or fainting
- Poisoning

Pediatric Emergencies

- Severe abdominal pain
- Appendicitis
- Severe asthma attacks
- Broken arms or legs
- Car accidents
- Croup requiring breathing treatments
- Head injuries (*with vomiting or not acting right*)
- Lacerations (cuts) that needs sutures
- Poisoning
- Seizures



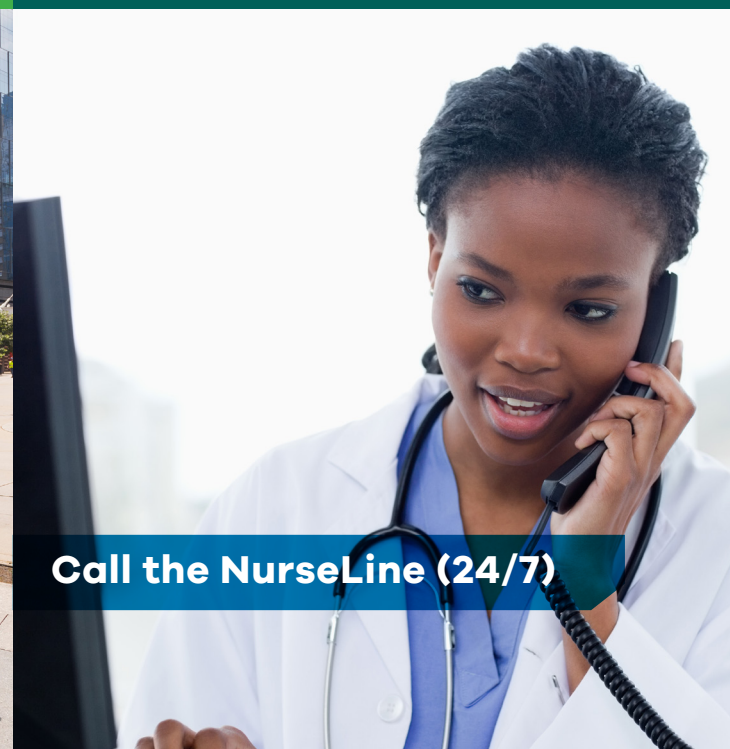
Call 911

CALL 911 RIGHT AWAY FOR THESE SYMPTOMS

- Life or limb threatening injury
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Signs of stroke, including sudden numbness, slurred speech, severe headache, weakness on one side of face or loss of consciousness
- Signs of heart attack, including chest pain, pain in the left arm or jaw, sudden weakness or dizziness
