6A celebrates staffing milestone



Staff on 6A saw a full recovery of a different sort this week.

In late 2022, 6A was closed because of high turnover rates. At the time, just five employees were left on the unit, and they were relocated to other units in the acute care division. The unit reopened six months later, in June 2023, with 24 travelers to staff 15 beds, and with Tammy Vieira, RN, MSN, assuming the role of nurse manager.

Over the next year, Vieira built a new nursing team, bringing in recent nursing graduates with a passion for patients and helping to turn several of the best traveling nurses into Denver Health employees.

The event also included a touching moment of silence led by individuals with lived experience, highlighting the urgent



need to prevent overdoses. Attendees came together to remember and honor the lives lost to overdose in 2023, emphasizing the collective commitment to raising awareness and supporting those affected by addiction. Through this observance, Denver Health underscored its dedication to addressing this critical issue and fostering a supportive community.

Denver Health wins NSF grant for first time

The National Science Foundation (NSF) has awarded Denver Health its first-ever NSF award, a one-year Lean Research Administration Model of Practice (RAMP) planning grant that positions the enterprise to amplify its existing Lean-based administration work into a largerscale systems implementation project in research administration.

The project could have wide-reaching implications across health care systems and academic centers engaged in research administration. Under the leadership of Amanda Breeden, associate chief of Research Operations and SPARO, the Office of Research for a decade has deployed Lean methodology to improve Denver Health's research infrastructure and increase its efficiencies.

"Reducing waste in the business of research is one main way that a learning health system like ours promotes the progress of science," Breeden said. "We believe that what we have can have major impact in research administration practices across the country."

Adobe Acrobat Sign replaces DocuSign

Denver Health's Information Technology team is implementing Adobe Acrobat Sign, which will go live before Saturday, Sept. 14. This new product will replace DocuSign for creating, sending and tracking e-signable documents for patients and external partners.





Important: If you currently use DocuSign for sending and tracking documents ("power users" who handle document creation and management), your manager will inform you when your team will begin the migration. If you only receive and sign documents (and do not manage or send them), you do not need to take any action. Users with external partner DocuSign interfaces are not affected by this change.




