



Adaptive Primary Care – We've changed our name Adaptive Primary Care opened in March of 2020 as the Spinal Cord Injury Primary Care Clinic. In May 2024, the name changed to better reflect the advanced services now offered to all

patients with mobility impairments. The clinic is staffed by Alicia Wong, MD and Patricia **Meyer, MD** who are both family medicine physicians. Our clinicians provide comprehensive primary care while also having increased understanding of medical conditions affecting patients with mobility disabilities. Adaptive Primary Care offers primary care services for patients with mobility impairments including: spinal cord injury, spina bifida, polio, cerebral palsy and others. Services are more accessible through the use of adaptive equipment

Adaptive Primary Care is part of the Primary Care Center, on the 7th floor of the Outpatient Medical Center. The clinic has weekly appointments. As of **June 12**, our EPIC referral will change from "Ambulatory Referral to Spinal Cord Injury Primary Care" to the new referral "Ambulatory Referral to Adaptive Primary Care". Referrals can be made for patients to
